<p>Entry Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BA Degree • At least 3 years union / Labour Support Organisation experience • Letter of Support from Union / Labour Support Organisation • Letter of Motivation from candidate • CV • Marks in previous studies should be at least 60% average • Formal, written commitment to return to unions/ Labour Support Organisation's for at least 2 years after completion 	<p>Entry Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BA Honours Degree • 7 years plus union / Labour Support Organisation experience • Research or Policy Experience in the Union / Labour Support Organisation • Letter of Support from Union / Labour Support Organisation • CV • Sample of Written Work • Marks in previous studies should be at least 65% average • Research Proposal (Max 2 pages) • Formal, written commitment to return to unions/ Labour Support Organisation's for at least 2 years after completion

Very Important!

No applicant will be permitted to work full-time and study full-time. Those who cannot be released from their positions during their studies must register part-time, taking the degree over 2 years.

This is a condition of registration, and non-negotiable.

2. Complete the **Wits University Online Application Form**
3. Send copies of **both application forms, plus supporting documents** to the Programme Coordinator on details listed at the end of this letter.
4. **Incomplete applications will not be considered.**
